Dear St. Matt's Friends,

Today I put into the mail both a card for our beloved nephew for his Confirmation *and* graduate announcements bearing pictures of our beloved son. At St. Matt's, we will recognize and bless our graduates on May 19. Also on that day, we will welcome new members to our community. Such a lot of prayers raised for these people at every stage of life taking next steps!

We mark milestones as a community for a reason. We ask friends and family and the congregation to come alongside us to celebrate and support us with prayers, affirmation and accountability because LIFE AND FAITH IS A TEAMSPORT. We all need shepherding all along life's way, from the font to the grave. We need the Spirit of Jesus guiding us, but we also need parents, mentors, guides, coaches and teachers and wise friends to help us figure out how to trust in God and in ourselves as we navigate the next steps on life's path. These people, along with Biblical examples, are the "great cloud of witnesses that surround us" as it says in the book of Hebrews. The promise we make to support one another at the time of baptism does not have an expiration date. Your presence, your participation and investment in the life of St. Matt's community are absolutely crucial to the health and wellbeing of all ages. It's also crucial for your own sense of connectedness and faith. Showing up and being invested is how we witness to our faith.

I have noticed that so much of spiritual mentoring is about simply being available to *listen deeply* to one another's stories and also to **honestly and humbly share our own stories**--what we have been through, what we have learned along the way, times when we have discovered God's grace and care. I would encourage you all to look for opportunities, both at St. Matt's and in your daily life, to make the effort to authentically connect with those around you in these ways. This is how we learn to faithfully take the next step, and the next step and the next. We are all just walking each other home.

Thank you all, for being part of my "cloud of witnesses" who show up and witness Jesus to me. I am thankful that for another year of life transitions, I will be...



A: Because the world teaches us we are supposed to be independent.


Q: What is your favorite part of church?

Council Retreat is set

On June 9, the Council will be taking part in a 3-hour retreat to develop mission, vision, core values and our strongest missional tugs. All this work is designed to ensure we are leading the congregation in its mission, staying on top of financial and property matters and following the constitution.



Council Meetings this summer

During our meeting last month, we decided to move our Council meetings to Wednesday evenings at 6:30 pm for the months of June-August. This change will allow us more flexibility and time with our families on the weekends.

We invite all members of St. Matthew's to attend our Council meetings which generally will be held the second Sunday of every month. Our next meeting will take place on Sunday, April 14 following worship. Approved meeting minutes will be made available upon request.

Our Call Process is on hold until fall

With a feeling of immense joy, I write to inform you that on Sunday, April 14 the Church Council unanimously voted to extend Pastor Kristen's contract with us. Her vision and leadership has helped us become a stronger, more unified congregation fully committed to doing God's work. We are incredibly blessed to have her agree to serving as our Interim Pastor through May 31, 2025. This announcement may come as a surprise as the Council announced just last month that our Call Committee was being formed.

Extending our time together is good for Pastor Kristen and for St. Matthew's. There is mutual respect and affection here. This decision brings stability for us all and removes the need to rush things. We have the full support of Bishop Tessa and Pastor Brad at the Synod level. And most importantly we feel God is at work in all of this and we are following the plan he currently has for us.

Here are our next steps:

- The Executive Team has begun work on Pastor's new contract which will go into effect June 1.
- Our Call Process is on hold until August and our intent is to submit our Call Paperwork to the Synod Office in January 2025.
- The members of the Call Committee have been informed of these changes and they have been invited to remain in their roles. However, we know this new timeline may not work for them, so we have asked them to discern and let us know how they wish to proceed by May 1.
- The members of the Call Committee will be announced in May, and they will be installed and receive their Orientation from Pastor Brad in August.

We ask you to pray for the Council, St. Matthew's Lutheran Community, and Pastor Kristen as we faithfully move forward listening to God's call. Trusting in his plan, we feel blessed to have the time and space needed to walk this journey together.
